FIRST, THE BAD NEWS:

There are more than 50 species of fairy ring capable of infesting areas such as sand-based golf course putting greens or tees and native soil areas commonly found in athletic fields, lawns and parks. Caused by a fungi group classified as Basidiomycetes, fairy ring infests cool as well as warm-season turfgrasses.



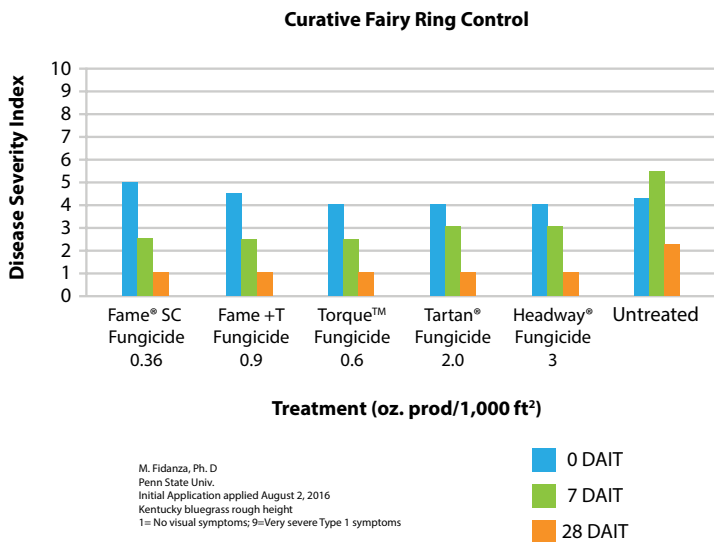
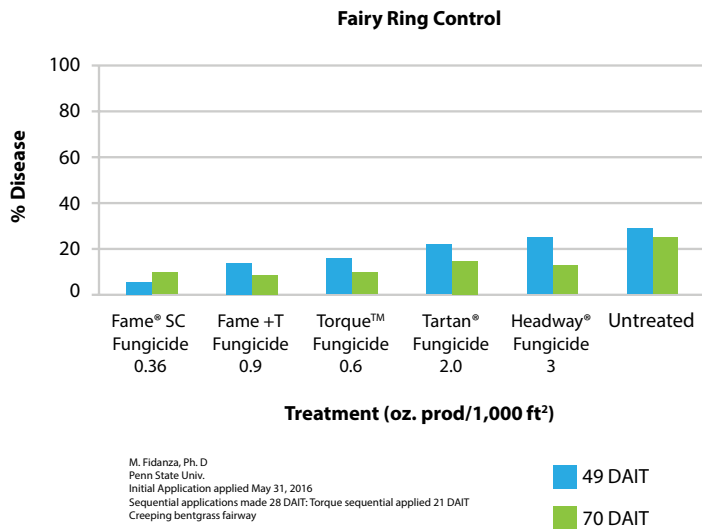

In cool-season turfgrass:

Apply 0.9 fl. oz./1,000 ft.² Fame® +T Fungicide, followed by 0.36 fl. oz./1,000 ft.² Fame® SC Fungicide 28 days later.



In warm-season turfgrass:

Make two applications of 0.36 fl. oz./1,000 ft.² Fame SC 28 days apart to control fairy ring.

Applications begin once soil temperatures at 2 inches reach 55 F.

Depending upon the season, it may require two to three applications for season-long management. Apply a wetting agent to aid in moving the active ingredient down into the soil profile where the pathogen is active.

It is also important to use a high spray volume (4 gal./1,000 ft.²) to move fungicide through thatch layer.
